


FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE

BOOK CORNER

This week, some statistics to remind us all why reading regularly at home is so important:

Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?



By the end of Year 6, Student A will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Student B will have read only 12 school days. While 20 minutes all in one go might not be appropriate for all learners of all ages, it is important to set aside regular time to read each day. This is highly likely to have a significant impact on each student's vocabulary, their success both in school and in later life.
